


Literacy	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Spelling Adding _es, to words ending in -y. ➤ Punctuation To identify the missing punctuation marks in a sentence. ➤ Grammar To rearrange the words and make meaningful sentences. 	<p>Refer to page no. 174 of the planner and encourage your child to read as many high frequency words as possible out loud to you. Encourage your child to spell some of them without looking at the word. Explain that when we add _es to a word that ends in one consonant followed by _y, we change the 'y' to 'i' and then add _es. For example: baby - babies</p> <p>Write a sentence on a strip of paper. Cut it up in different parts. Mix up the sentence. Encourage your child to rearrange the jumbled words to form a sentence. Talk to your child about the use of punctuation marks in the sentence. Now ask your child to include punctuation marks to their sentence. Encourage your child to use a variety of punctuation marks to change the effect of the sentence. Talk about which part of the story is your child's favourite and discuss the reasons for their choice.


Share different ideas or ways in which the story ending can be twisted to make it more engaging for the reader.


Topics based on Gap Analysis from Term 3

To calculate mathematical statements for addition and subtraction and write them using the addition (+), subtraction (-) and equals (=) signs

To understand that subtraction is the inverse of addition or vice versa.

To solve word problems involving addition and subtraction.

Share and model a variety of strategies to add or subtract numbers e.g. by counting mentally, counting objects, drawing lines etc.



$$8 + 5 = 13$$
$$15 - 6 = 9$$
$$57 + 7 = 64$$
$$99 - 11 = 88$$
$$35 + 52 = 87$$
$$75 - 31 = 44$$
$$30 + 1$$

Talk to your child addition and subtraction related.

e.g. $27 + 5 = 32$ $32 - 5 = 27$

Pose a problem such as, "Annie has 11 crayons. She gets 18 more. How many crayons does she have in all?" Help your child understand the question by highlighting important information, then make a plan to solve, and then follow out that plan. **Encourage** your child to check his or her answer. Repeat the activity again using other word problems that involve different operations.




Science

- Describe how different habitats provide for the basic needs of different kinds of animals and plants, and how they depend on one another.
- Analyze the ways animals adapt to their habitats in order to more effectively catch food, stay safe from predators, and care for their young.

Talk to your child about the different places where they see animals and plants living. How do plants and animals survive in any habitat (place).
Share with your child pictures of different habitats or ask them to use the internet to find out more about different habitats. (Give clues – vegetation – types of trees, animals, climate etc)
Think Ask children to think of any other ways in which animals might be dependent on plants?
Encourage children to write down all their findings and make a booklet on habitats.
 Share with children examples of plants and birds co-habiting. Eg. Birds nesting in trees or bushes, squirrels living in trees, owls nesting in holes in trees, butterflies laying their eggs on plants etc. Plants can provide shade and/ or protection from heavy rain as well as shelter from animals.
